



Project Update

Loose wet avalanches and falling slush/snow pillows are possible with continued warm temperatures. Do not stand, walk or park under steep cut banks or below overhanging snow pillows. Rockfall is also a hazard with current wet weather pattern. Cooling trend expected Saturday.

**CAUTION: Winter Road Conditions – Be Prepared!
Large pools of water on road in a variety of locations
4 x 4 vehicles recommended**

KM	Activity along the Lillooet River FSR when roads are open
KM 37.5	Check Point Booth is in place 24 hr/day.
KM 38.5	Tunnelling at the Boulder Creek HEF. Blasting will occur daily.
KM 39	Access road plowed for first 100 metres.
KM 41.2	Upper Lillooet River HEF Powerhouse site is currently closed.
KM 41.8	Spur road to spoil area will be active with truck hauling in and out
KM 42	Lillooet River Trail is OPEN and parking area has been cleared. Temporary signage and flagging are in place to route hikers through the area. Do NOT park on the FSR.
KM 44	Upper Lillooet River HEF Downstream Tunnel Portal site open. Blasting will occur daily.
KM 47-49	Upper Lillooet River HEF Upstream Tunnel Portal site open.

Snow clearing along Lillooet River FSR

- Snow clearing from KM 0-49.
- Pullouts for snowmobiles will be maintained where snow clearing ends. Please ensure vehicles do not block the FSR.
- Parking lots at KM 8.5 and 42 will be kept cleared.
- **Active and passive control of avalanche zones may occur along the Lillooet River FSR and the road can be closed at any time for such control activities, if and when required. Avalanche technicians will block the road on either side of avalanche control area during control activities and once the area is deemed safe, the road will be reopened.**
- Plans are subject to change and will be communicated regularly via these notifications.
